# Well-Known Walmart Manager Calls It A Day

#### **BY JENNIFER JACKSON** Staff Reporter

More than 120 people gathered in the women's apparel department at the Clinton Walmart on Wednesday morning, July 26, to mark the retirement of store manager Jane Marshall.

The location was appropriate, as Jane had worked in the apparel department at the old Walmart store in Clinton, where she started as a cashier in 1975.

In two years, Jane worked her way to assistant manager, and in 1979, was promoted to manager of the store in Warsaw, becoming the first female store manager of a Walmart in the country.

"It was remarkable at the time, and probably challenging as well," said John Kritos, a Walmart "Market People Partner,"e.g. Human Relations staff.

Kritos, who works in Kansas City, welcomed everyone to the party and presented Jane with an award for her time with the company, citing her trail-blazing leadership and vision.

"We're all here to celebrate a Walmart legend," he said. "Everybody in Clinton and the surrounding area knows who she is."



A STORIED RETAILING CAREER came to an end with the retirement of Clinton Walmart Store Manager Jane Marshall who began as a cashier in 1975. Walmart Regional Manager Hanna Diamond attended a reception for Marshall where she presented her with a bouquet.

Jane is famous for her friendly smile, her reputation for treating everybody with respect no matter what the situation, and for never losing her temper.

"She's known for being there for the customers and the associates," Brian Woirhave said.

Jane's career was featured as the lead story on the Walmart World website, and Walmart radio ran "shout-outs" to Jane all over the country on July 26, Kritos said.

Hanna Diamond, a regional manager, presented Jane with flowers, and Derrell Dulaban, one of the store management team, presented her with an Adirondack chair and table set on behalf of the Clinton store. Kritos also presented Jane with a bag of decaf coffee and a large bag of honev-barbecue UTZ potato chips, her favorite.

Jane said that when she appointed a Walmart store manager, she didn't realize she was the first female in that role.

AL D. LOPITI OT FLUAY, JUN 28th, the Clinton Fire Department was dispatched to 501 East Ohio Street on a reported cooking fire in the kitchen of the residence. The on-duty crew of 3 personnel responded in 2 apparatus. Fire Chief Mark Manuel was first to arrive on scene and reported heavy pressurized smoke coming from the home as well as active fire on an enclosed porch area in the rear of the home. A second alarm was requested for a working structure fire and the need for additional personnel.

Upon arrival of the on-duty fire crew at 5:16pm, suppression efforts immediately began after determining that no one was inside the home. Due to the complexity of the construction of the home, the extent of the fire upon arrival, extreme ambient outdoor temperatures, and lack of initial response personnel on scene, suppression efforts were very difficult. Deputy Fire Chief Matt Willings arrived on scene shortly after the

on-duty crew. With only 2 personnel able to conduct fire suppression operations initially, Chief Willings assisted in fire attack operations until more personnel arrived on scene.

The extreme outdoor temperatures created a very unsafe environment for fire firefighters. With

exhausted resources and the need for additional assistance, Fire Chief Mark Manuel requested a 3rd alarm for personnel and mutual aid assistance from Deepwater Fire Department. Mutual Aid assistance was also requested from Calhoun Fire Department. Both departments

combined provided a total of 8 personnel. These 8 individuals were critical to the positive outcome of this incident.

The cause of the fire was determined to be caused by a grease fire that started on the stove in the kitchen. The fire Fire Page 3

"What stands out for me is how I was treated," she said, emphasizing the "I." "The people I worked with were all men, but I was always treated with respect." Connie Freeman, а Walmart HR manager in Kansas City, was one of several people who shared "Jane" stories at the party. Connie's grandmother worked with Jane when she was promoted to assistant store manager in 1977, and moved to the women's apparel department.

"We decided to make some changes," Jane said, referring to how they displayed clothing. "We tripled sales."

At the retirement party, Jane introduced members of her management team, including Doug Burke and Darrell Dulaban, who she called the cornerstones of the store.

"It's good to be able to leave with a solid foundation," Jane said. "Nothing will change when I walk out the door."

Doug assured Jane that they will keep the shelves filled and the garbage picked up in the parking lot.

Jane said that there's nothing her hard-working team can't do, including shepherding the store through a planned remodel. The project, scheduled for next year, will take 14 to 16 weeks, she said. Doug said he had worked at the current Walmart store since it opened in the late 1990s.

Jane also introduced her family: spouse Bill Marshall, brother in-law John French, who worked at the Warsaw store with Jane, sister Linda Ferro French, known as "Woo," who used to own the W W Hallmark Store in Clinton, their brother Mike Ferro and spouse Marilyn, and Jane's niece, Shelby.

"She is continuing the family legacy by coming to work in two weeks in the pharmacy," Jane said.

Jane also introduced John Marshall, her and Bill's younger son. In retirement,

Robin Torretta, a Walmart HR manager in Springfield, had "Jane for President" T-shirts which she and others were wearing at the party. Robin explained that Jane always said what she thought and what needed to be said. Afterwards, one of the staff would send out texts of her statements to other store managers. which he headed "Jane for President."

Highlights of Jane's nearly 5 decades with Walmart include meeting founder Sam Walton and his son Rob Walton, she said, and having dinner with the family. People have told Jane that they're glad to hear she's retiring and will be able to enjoy life, but she said her years with Walmart were amazing.

"You don't do something for 48 years and not enjoy it," she said.

Jane's last day is Aug. 11, but she has two weeks of time off due, so was finishing up last week. No replacement has been named, Kritos said, but applications have been accepted from inside and outside the company, he said, with 75 percent of promotions coming from within.

Sam Walton credited Walmart's rapid growth to his sales associates, with whom he set up profit-sharing plans. He opened the first Walmart store in Rogers, Ark., in 1962, when he was 44 years old. He based his business on lower prices, good service and convenience, locating stores in small towns. Walmart hit both the baby-boomer decades of family consumerism and the reverse migration from cities to small towns in the 1990s, where people wanted the same choices in merchandise and sale prices found in city stores.

Born in Oklahoma in 1918, Samuel Moore Walton grew up in Missouri, and was the youngest Eagle Boy Scout in the state's history when he was in 8th grade in Shelbina. He graduated from high school in Columbia and from the University of Missouri with a degree in economics in 1940, and served in the U.S. Army Intelligence Corps. By 1990, Walmart was the largest retailer in the United States. Considered the greatest innovator in the history of retail business, Walton died in 1992, age 74, shortly after receiving the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Walmart grew to become the world's largest corporation based on revenue, and the world's biggest private employee. The Clinton store is No. 20.

partment as well for their assistance with traffic control and overall willingness to assist where needed.

In total, fire crews were on scene for approximately 5 hours.

"I have made life-long friends," Davin said. "They are literally like family to me. They are my brothers and sisters."

Davin was elected head of the lodge last April for a one-year term. The year he joined, he stepped into the office of esteemed lecturing knight, then moved up the ranks to loyal knight, then leading knight.

"It made my transition here much easier," he said of joining the lodge and getting involved in its leadership.

The Clinton Elks Lodge has 750 members, many of them young men with families. It is one of the last remaining lodges in the country where all the members are male. Davin said. There is no rule about it, he said, it's just that no women have been proposed for membership, at least since he's been there. Women are welcome at lodge events. Many people join for the social aspect, Davin said. The lodge has a kitchen where a cook prepares dinners Wednesday through Saturday nights. Thursdays, when there is a taco bar, rivals Friday as the popular night, drawing a crowd of 150.

"If you don't get there by 5:30 p.m., it's hard to get a spot," he said.

Davin brings his family, spouse Ashlynn and their two sons, ages 8 and 4. There's a kids' area, and lodge offspring run around with each other, and you don't have to worry about them like you would at a public restaurant, he said.

After-dinner entertainment is card games, Davin said. The lodge has two balconies, front and back, he said, where they put fans out and listen to music.

"With its view over the

friendships, Davin said what he likes about the Elks is they give back to the community. The lodge supports the Elks Benevolent Trust, which funds the Missouri state Elks project, a mobile dental clinic for underprivileged children.

"We've expanded it to veterans," Davin said of dental care.

The national Elks organization is one of the largest fraternal organizations in the country, with more than 1.1 million members. That number is growing, according to Davin, who attended the national convention in Minneapolis in July.

"We give out more scholarships than the federal government," he said.

The Clinton lodge holds an annual auction to raise money for veteran and youth projects, which include scholarships for graduating seniors and an annual day at the Springfield zoo for area students.

The Elks organization started as a group of entertainers, but has grown to include people from all walks of life, including famous sports figures, U.S. senators and presidents Franklin D. Roosevelt, Harry Truman and John F. Kennedy were Elks. The membership is known for patriotism, Davin said. The Clinton lodge holds annual dinners for veterans and first responders and their spouses. The veterans dinner, held in the week before Olde Glory Days, drew almost 200 people last June, Davin said.

"If you look at any flagpole in this town, it's probably flying a flag that was donated by the Elks," he said.

Belonging to the Elks entitles members to visit the 2,100 Elks lodges around the country, some of which have campgrounds, golf courses and bowling alleys, Davin said. Some lodges offer spots in their parking lots, sometimes with electric hook-ups. The Cape Girardeau Elks Lodge has 100-plus woodacres surrounding a 38-acre lake stocked with fish, and a pontoon boat available to members at no cost.

To be eligible for membership in the Elks, you must be over the age of 21, a U.S. citizen and believe in God. Each prospective member is sponsored by a lodge member in good standing, must have two references and is voted on by the entire lodge. Annual dues at the Clinton lodge is \$81.

Davin Newman's State Farm Insurance agency is located at 100 N. Main. on the northeast corner of the Square at Main and Franklin.

Linda wants people to know if they want to see the carousel in action this vear, they should plan to come this month.

Linda acquired the carousel after learning that the traveling carnival that brought rides to the Appleton City Fair every year had closed, due to the death of the owner

This year, the fair will be Saturday, August 19, at the park. A family-oriented celebration, it features kids' games, a petting zoo, bounce castles and contests. There's also a corn hole tournament, a street dance and a parade at 5 p.m.

The carousel will be open from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. on August 19, and weekend evenings, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays, through Sept. 3, the Sunday of Labor Day weekend.

After purchasing the carousel in 2021, Linda spent a year having a site cleared near the park, on the corner of the 100 block of 4th Street/Hwy. 52 W. She wanted the carousel housed in an octagonal building whose sides open, which she had built. She operates it as a non-profit. The price of a ride is whatever people want to pay, as long as it's a U.S. paper bill and you don't want change. The income covers the electric bill.

Linda said she is having egg-shaped ornaments of the carousel made with the animals going around it. Her carousel, circa 2000, is menagerie style, with eight horses and 10 other different animals, including a giraffe, elephant and a zebra. For safety reasons, the weight limit for riders on the animals is 150 pounds, although anyone can sit on benches on the carousel, or stand beside riders who are small. 



Hazing Again? Just Saying ....

What a tough topic. The definition of hazing is easy, but nothing is easy after that. Definition: Being subjected to harassment or ridicule. Every few years hazing comes to the forefront. It never seems to go away. We have to be more honest about the environments and the dynamics that encourage hazing.




With the Northwestern University sports scandal, hazing is in the news again. Many students have stepped forward, even filing lawsuits. Hazing can be subtle, but can also be violent. Many college students have died from hazing. There has been at least one university hazing death each year from 1969 to 2021. There have been 40 hazing deaths between 2007 and 2017 alone. Alcohol poisoning is the cause of hazing biggest deaths. What can be done? I am not an expert, but after supervising kids for 40+ years, I have a thought or two. First, I think two things ought be understood. to All organizations (Fraternities, Football Teams, or Chess Clubs) have and even need 'Induction Ceremonies' or 'Freshmen Initiations'. In other words, how are new members accepted into the group? Two, we need to accept the proposition that there is a human need to 'Rank': Seniors vs Freshmen, Veterans vs Rookies, the Big Guy vs the Not So Big, Skilled vs Not-Skilled, Popular vs Not-So-Popular, Boss vs Rank and File, White Collar vs Blue Collar, etc. As a social unit, this ranking practice is dynamic and will continue. In fact, it could be argued that even the lower-ranked person benefits from having a clear idea of where he or she fits in. Therefore they can develop a plan for change, (if that is what they want).

"OK Seniors, you can "Freshman have a Induction Week, but you Will Not haze. Here are the guidelines."

The 'ceremonies' have to be done in an appropriate way. It is similar to principals saying, "OK seniors you can have a Senior Skip Day, but this is how it will be done." or "OK Seniors you can do an end-of-the-year prank, but here are the guidelines."


